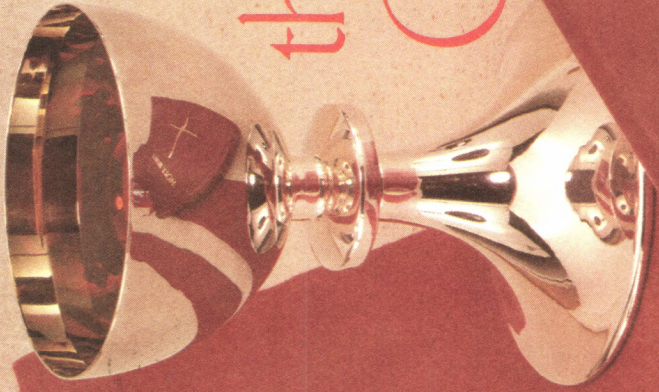

## Confirmation Service

(P)astor: These persons have been instructed in the Christian faith and desire to make public affirmation of their Baptism.

*(Confirmands' names are read. Each confirmand stands as name is said.)*

(P) Dear friends, we rejoice that you now desire to make public profession of your faith and assume greater responsibility in the life of our Christian community and its mission in the world.

Brothers and sisters in Christ: In Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you members of His Church. In the community of God's people, you have learned from His Word God's loving purpose for you and all creation. You have been called to be witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Now, therefore, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.

Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises?

*(Response: I do.)*

(P) Do you believe in one God, the Father the Son, and the Holy Spirit? If so, would you please confess together the faith of the Church using the Apostle's Creed.

*(Response: all confirmands say together the Apostle's Creed.)*

(P) Do you accept Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior?

*(Response: I do.)*

*(Prayers are said. There will be a pause during each petition for silent prayer, concluded by the pastor leading the congregation's verbal response with "Lord, in your mercy,...")*

(P) Let us pray for those who are affirming their baptism through their confession of faith today, and for all who bear the name of Christ everywhere:

That they may be redeemed from all evil and rescued from the way of sin and death:

Lord, in your mercy,

(C)ongregation: Hear our prayer.

(P) That the Holy Spirit may open their hearts to your grace and truth:

Lord, in your mercy,

(C) Hear our prayer.

(P) That they may be kept in the faith and communion of your holy Church:

Lord, in your mercy,

(C) Hear our prayer.

(P) That they may be sent into the world in witness to your love:

Lord, in your mercy,

(C) Hear our prayer.

(P) That they may be brought to the fullness of your peace and glory:

Lord, in your mercy,

(C) Hear our prayer.

(P) Gracious Lord, we pray these things for all who name the

name of Christ our Lord, but this day we especially ask that you would hear and answer our prayer on behalf of Susan, Michael, Matthew, and Tracie. Into your hands, O Lord, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

(C) Amen.

(P) You have made public profession of your faith. In the presence of Almighty God I therefore ask you: Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism, living in God's grace and power:

To live among God's faithful people, to be faithful in hearing His Word and receiving His Supper, to follow Christ our Lord wherever He may lead you, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through your words and deeds, to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus, to strive for justice and peace in all the earth, and to remain firm in this faith and in His church to the end?

*(Each person answers in turn.)*

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

(P) Is it your intention to continue to study His Word and to be regular in attendance at worship and in prayer, to live your life in harmony with the Gospel of Christ as revealed in Holy Scripture, and to accept as your own the mission of Christ's Church in the world?

*(Each person answers in turn.)*

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

(P) Confirmation is an important stage, but only one of the many stages in a lifetime of learning at the feet of our Lord and of service to all of humanity. The Church expects you to continue to learn and to assume always greater responsibilities as members of the family of God,

and as ambassadors of Christ in the World.

I would like to ask the parents, the baptismal sponsors present today, and those who have taught any of these confirmands through the years in the Sunday School or other organizations of our church to please stand.

*(Those named above are asked to stand)*

(P) On behalf of the entire Church, I would like to thank you for your active participation in the spiritual growth and development of these confirmands. You are able to see today the fruit of your prayers, your teaching, your example of Christ living in you. Continue to remember these confirmands in your prayers. Continue to encourage them to take part in the life of the congregation, and help them to discover their place next to your side in the service of Christ our Lord in this congregation. Work together with them in the furtherance of Christ's kingdom here in this community, and around the world. Paul's words to the Corinthians is also true for you when he says, "Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

I would like to invite the parents of the confirmands to come forward for the laying on of hands, the prayer of dedication, and join their children in the communion service.

*(Those named may come forward. Others standing may be seated. Those being confirmed kneel).*

(P) Let us pray.

Gracious Lord, through water and the Spirit you have made these men and women your own. You forgave them all their sins and brought them to newness of life. Continue to strengthen them with the Holy Spirit, and daily increase in them your gifts of grace: the spirit of

wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord.

(C) Amen.

*(The pastor lays his hands on the head of each being confirmed. The parents lay their hands on their child's head. Then the following prayer is said:)*

(P) Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in \_\_\_\_\_ the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm (his/her) faith, guide (his/her) life, empower (him/her) in (his/her) serving, give (him/her) patience in suffering, and bring (him/her) to everlasting life.

*(Each person being confirmed answers: "Amen." Following the last to be confirmed, the confirmands shall stand, and the pastor greets those having been confirmed with these words.)*

(P) On behalf of the congregation, I would like to welcome you into confirmed and communicant membership in our congregation. May the vows, promises, and prayers made this day be fulfilled in your life.

*(Presentations are made)*

(P) Go in peace. Serve the Lord.

(All:) Thanks be to God.

*(The service continues with the Lord's Supper. Those confirmed with their parents are asked to step back while the preparations are being made. The confirmands and their parents are the first to be communed.)*

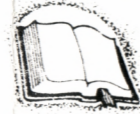

**The Lord's Supper**

The Lutheran Church believes that Jesus Christ is Himself really present in the bread and wine, sharing with us His actual body and blood, assuring us that our sins are forgiven, and strengthening and equipping us to serve others, and share His life in the world.

Our Communion is open to all believers in Christ. Baptized children may come forward with their parents for prayer. Children who are entitled to commune in their home congregations are asked to hold up one finger to indicate this during the reception of the bread.

At Bethel, those who are pre-confirmation children and who wish to commune are to be regular worshippers who have requested and completed communion instruction with the Pastor, a Deacon, and parent(s).

**First Lesson** Acts 1:8-14

You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." And when he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away; and when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. All these with one accord devoted themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

**Second Lesson**

1 Peter 4:12-17; 5:6-11

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal which comes upon you to prove you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice in so far as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed. If you are reproached for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or a thief, or a wrongdoer, or a mischief-maker; yet if one suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but under that name let him glorify

God. For the time has come for judgment to begin with the household of God; and if it begins with us, what will be the end of those who do not obey the gospel of God? Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that in due time he may exalt you. Cast all your anxieties on him, for he cares about you. Be sober, be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking some one to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same experience of suffering is required of your brotherhood throughout the world. And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, establish, and strengthen you. To him be the dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

**Gospel** John 17:1-11

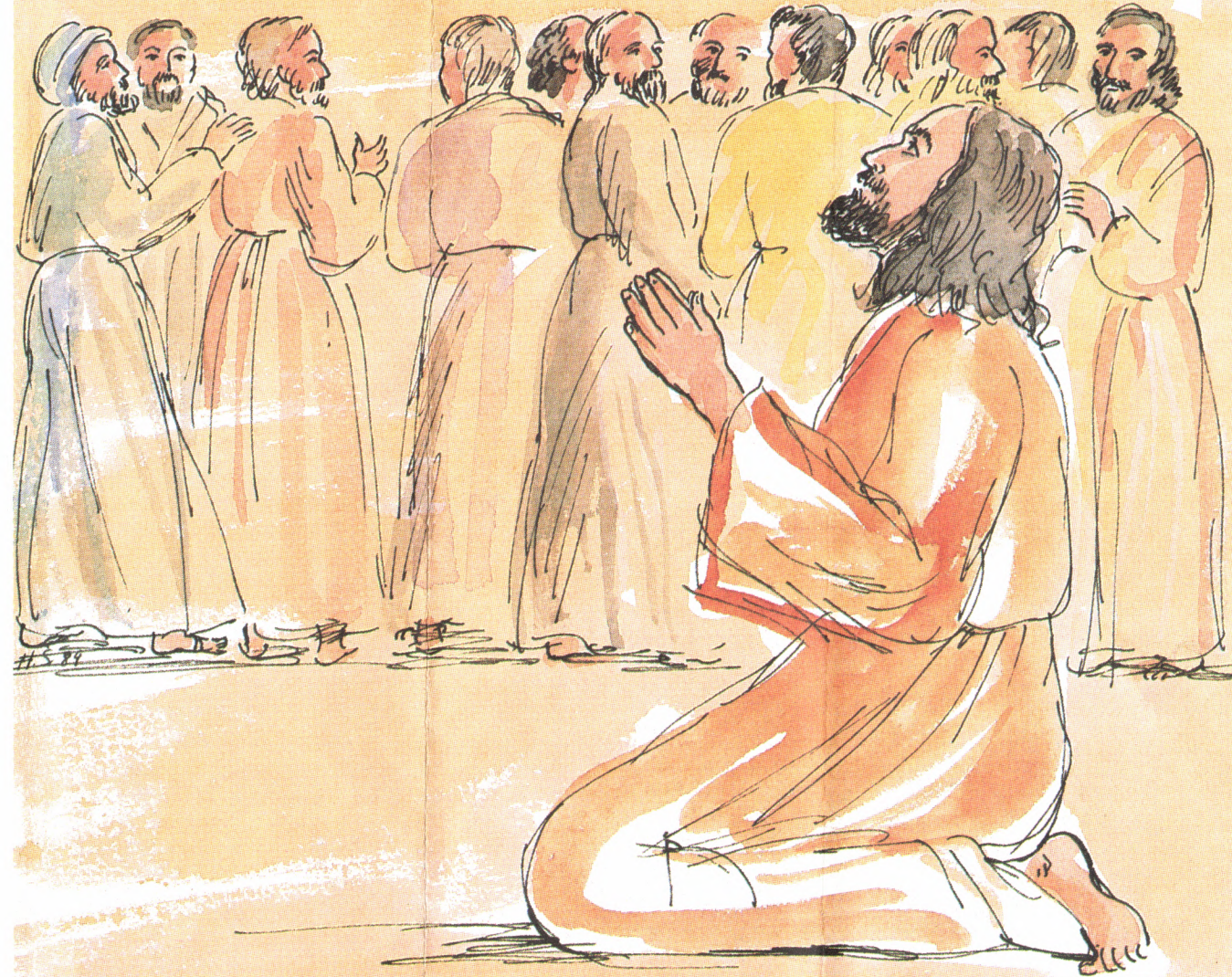
When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify thy Son that the Son may glorify thee, since thou hast given him power over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom thou hast given him. And this is eternal life, that they know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent. I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do; and now, Father, glorify thou me in thy own presence with the glory which I had with thee before the world was made. I have manifested thy name to the men whom thou gavest me out of the world; thine they were, and thou gavest them to me, and they have kept thy word. Now they know that everything that thou hast given me is from thee; for I have given them the words which thou gavest me, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from thee; and they have believed that thou didst send me. I am praying for them; I am not praying for the world but for those whom thou hast given me, for they are thine; all mine are thine, and thine are mine, and I am glorified in them. And now I am no more in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to thee. Holy Father, keep them in thy name, which thou hast given me, that they may be one, even as we are one.

**Sharing the Glory**

"Glory, glory, hallelujah!" The musical refrain is such a rouser that its joyful spirit expresses the meaning of the words exactly. It is the climax! The culmination! Bursting excitement brimming with fulfillment! Something for everyone to hear!

That is what Jesus anticipated in his concluding prayer in the presence of the disciples. Glorify my last act, prayed Jesus. With the unimaginable splendour of that act, inspire my disciples, that they will further glorify me, and with me you, Father. Grant that with us they will join the glory of the truth in faith. Jesus continued: Let the disciples spread wide the opportunity for others to receive the glory of unity with God through faith.

Jesus' prayer was clear and direct: a prayer for glorification of his final sacrifice as the way to share God's saving truth with everyone who will receive. May we also share the glory with others!

## *Suddenly, the Lord*


THE DISCIPLES had fished all night and had caught nothing. Jesus told them to drop their nets again. Peter protested, but obeyed, and their nets almost broke with the weight of the fish. Suddenly Peter cried, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord."

In a flash Peter must have sensed the lordship of Christ, and his own unworthiness to be with him. Most of us know that we are unworthy. We've been taught this truth from childhood. Each Sunday, by habit, glibly and by rote, we confess our sins.

Occasionally perhaps, the full weight of our unworthiness bursts upon us, and we know that we really don't belong in the company of one so pure as Jesus. But, fortunately, we have also been taught a parallel great truth. Jesus receives us as we are. He wants us with him. He forgives us and stands ready to help us to the better life. Peter, too, learned this, and despite his failings, which were many, he became one of Jesus' most effective and loyal followers.

For the Christian the most tragic misunderstanding is to think of oneself as "worthy." We then become proud, complacent, insensitive, and quite useless in the kingdom. Not until the time, perhaps in some blazing moment, when we realize our unworthiness, can Christ use us. And we obey him, not primarily out of fear, but out of gratitude.

Until the end of life our obedience will be the only possible response of gratitude for the unmerited gift of forgiveness and life which he has given us.

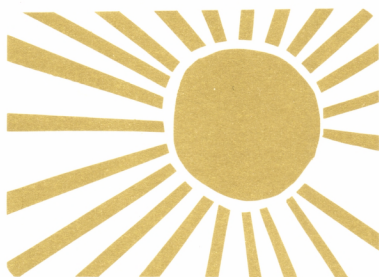
