

## Popular Farmer Passes Away

The people of this community were surprised to hear on Thursday of last week of the very sudden death of Jacob Aadland, a farmer who resided about thirteen miles northwest of Loreburn. The previous day Mr. Aadland went to Moose Jaw for treatment for blood poisoning in one of his fingers, but at the time he left here it was not thought his condition was critical. About two weeks ago deceased ran a splinter of wood into his finger and in getting it out with a rusty pin caused blood poisoning, and while everything possible was done to check the poison, it resulted in his death.

Mr. Aadland was ~~61~~ 59 years old and had resided in this district since 1907, arriving here that year from South Dakota. With the exception of about two years in running a garage at Strongfield, he spent the rest of the time on his well improved farm west of Strongfield. He was popular and well known throughout the district, each fall having two and three threshing outfits in operation. He leaves a wife, three sons and one daughter, all of whom reside at home, and to whom sincere sympathy is extended in their sudden bereavement.

The funeral was held on Sunday at Skudesnes Church, the services being conducted by Rev. Mr. Gestfjeld, pastor of the local Norwegian congregation, and it was very largely attended by people from Loreburn, Strongfield and Elbow. Interment was in the Skudesnes cemetery. Many flowers testified to the popularity of the deceased.
