whose subject I was. And further, that I never have borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the degrees of Nobility of the Country whereof
I have been a subject, and that I have resided within the United States for five years last past, and in this State for one year last past.

IN COUNTY COURT.

BE IT REMEMBERED, That on the 3rd day of Nov in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
dred and ninety — personally appeared before the Honorable George Bryant
Judge of the County Court of Day County, for the State aforesaid J. Helgeson Sybre
an alien born, above the age of twenty-one years; and applied in open court to be admitted to become a naturalized citizen of the United States
of America, pursuant to the several acts of Congress heretofore passed on that subject. And the said J. Helgeson Sybre
having thereupon produced to the Court record testimony, showing that he had heretofore
reported himself and filed his declaration of his intention to become a citizen of the United States; according to the provisions of said several acts
of Congress; and the Court being satisfied, as well from the oath of the said J. Helgeson Sybre
as from the testimony of Charles A. Young

and Hans L. Aadland who are known to be citizens of the United States, that the said
J. Helgeson Sybre has resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United
States for at least five years last past, and at least one year last past within the State of South Dakota, and that during the whole of that
time he has behaved himself as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles contained in the Constitution of the United
States, and well disposed to the good order, well being and happiness of the same; and two years and upwards having elapsed since the said
J. Helgeson Sybre reported himself and filed his declaration of intention as aforesaid:

IT WAS ORDERED, That the said J. Helgeson Sybre be permitted to take the oath to support the
Constitution of the United States, and the usual oath whereby he renounced all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Power, Prince, Potentate,
State or Sovereignty whatever, and more particularly to The King of Norway & Sweden whereof he was heretofore a
subject; which said oath having been administered to the said J. Helgeson Sybre
by the Clerk of said Court, it is ordered by the Court that the said J. Helgeson Sybre
be admitted to all and singular the rights, privileges and immunities of a naturalized citizen of the United States, and that the same be
certified by the Clerk of this Court, under the seal of said Court, which is done accordingly.
