Obituary

Helen was born to William and Susan Schroeder on November 15th, 1926 at Drake, Saskatchewan. She grew up on the farm west of Drake.

Through mutual friends Helen met her future husband at an anniversary. She was married to Robert Kerney on November 3, 1954. They set up residence on a farm near Loreburn. Helen was a busy homemaker helping on the farm and raising her ten children. She was also very active in church, school and community.

They moved from the farm into Loreburn in the spring of 1985, where she continued to serve as the caretaker at the local high school. She was forced into early retirement due to health conditions. But she continued to remain active in her church, at Bible study, Sunday School, in the ELW, the Town and Country Seniors Club, as well as acting correspondent for the Outlook and Davidson papers.

In the fall of 1994 her health took a serious turn for the worse. But even amidst persistent health concerns, she continued to reach out to others and tried to plan for the future. The Lord, however, saw fit to take her Home to be with Him on August 3, 1995 at 11:45 a.m.

by growing up in a small town in north-east North Dakota as the oldest daughter in an Icelandic farmer's family of twelve children, of whom nine are still living. Their closeness has been something of the finest support to Janice... 'good medicine'!...especially in these last months.

Upon finishing high school, her yearbook picture was captioned as one who would "look after the little lost boys"!...maybe preparing for a family of all sons and a husband!

Even though she was trained in a business school and a school of nursing, and did work briefly as a church secretary and in nursing, especially Home Care, she always sensed her first calling to be support for her husband and mother to her children.

She loved to sing and was often called upon for funerals and other occasions. She enriched our lives, too, with her interests in curling, Home and School, and Summer Players' community musicals. But any work or activities she did outside the home was never to interfere with her family...and always motivated to assist other people. In dealing with cancer, she became a resource and support to others facing the same challenge, with referrals to her also being made by doctors.

Every location of work by her husband became her home, whether in the remoteness of Southern Rhodesia (Zimbabwe) in Africa, or briefly in her home country of the United States, or here in the 'foreign land' of Canada which gradually became her love...resulting in citizenship in both countries four years ago.

She battled her cancer vigorously in every way... convinced that the faith, attitude, exercise, diet, vitamins, some alternative efforts, support of family and friends, as well as the medical approach all contributed in the fight...which did give her four good years of excellent health.

Obviously, there is no guaranteed solution to the evil of disease in this imperfect world. In the last nine months she coped with severe pain every single day (we could not have wished for that to continue), partly because she wanted to be alert to relate to family and friends. But the faith upholds, even when God's way is to provide the perfect solution on the other side of this life.

Janice was diagnosed with cancer in 1992 on the same date as Allan was elected as bishop in 1993. Her funeral today is on the same date and in the same place as Allan was installed as bishop in 1993. She accompanied him to at least 3/4 of the parishes in his jurisdiction. But most significantly, she died on All Saints' Sunday at 3:55 p.m., surrounded by her family while Allan read scriptures, having just concluded I Corinthians 15.

The sun shone brightly that day - a reminder of God's gift of one of the finest summer and fall seasons we have known here, where Janice loved so much to walk and bicycle in the out-of-doors. Such a fine day to join the saints of all time and space, with whom we believers are joined in spirit.

Janice and her family have always been deeply grateful for the support of prayer and expressions from far and wide in the church and the public. While the bishop's call is to be a pastor to pastors and congregations, the full family circle of faith has been experienced in the pastoring of both laity and clergy to the bishop and family! God bless each of you in your caring. God bless Janice's memory to us all.

Janice's Life History

The death of Janice Elaine Grundahl, age 57, of Saskatoon, occurred on Sunday, November 2, 1997, at St. Paul's Hospital after a five year battle with cancer.

She is survived by her husband, **Allan**, sons: **Nathan**, and **Joel** both of Saskatoon, and **Jason** and **Marcus** both of Regina;

sisters: **Diane** (Nels) Fossum of Grand Forks, ND, **Eileen** (Ken) Block of LaFayette, MN, **Velma** (Jim) May of Roy, Utah; brothers: **Gerald** Davidson of Milton, ND, **Vernon** Davidson of Grand Forks, ND, **Wayne** Davidson of Fargo, ND, **Dale** (Gayle) Davidson, **Dennis** Davidson, and **David** (Melody) Davidson, all of Grandforks, ND; and numerous nieces and nephews.

She was predeceased by her parents, one brother and one sister.

Born on July 27, 1940 in Edinburg, ND, Janice grew up and received her education in Milton, ND and attended business college in Fargo, ND. She graduated from the Lutheran Bible Institute in Minneapolis, MN in 1961, where she met her husband-to-be. She then graduated from Bethesda School of Nursing as an LPN in St. Paul, MN in 1963.

Janice married Allan on June 7, 1963 in Minneapolis, MN. They moved to Southern Rhodesia (Zimbabwe) in Africa in 1963 and stayed there until 1965, at which time they returned to St. Paul, MN for one year while Allan completed seminary.

In 1966 they moved to Midale, SK, serving the parish there until 1970, when they moved to Moose Jaw, SK until 1975, then to New Richland, MN for two years. Their final move was to Saskatoon in 1978 until the present.

Janice was primarily concerned to fulfill her calling as a homemaker, but also enjoyed singing, church activities, nursing, community musicals, and giving support to others, especially cancer patients. She enjoyed the outdoors for walking and cycling.

In lieu of flowers, donations to any ministry of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, Canadian Cancer Society, or a charity of the donor's choice are appreciated.

Burial will follow at Hillcrest Memorial Gardens.

Funeral Service Notes

God's gift to us in Janice is reflected in a number of expressions today.

The **family flowers on the casket** indicate her life-long desire for modesty, but are meaningful with her favorite flower: a simple display of five roses...a red one for her husband and four yellow ones for her sons.

This **service folder cover** is designed by son, **Nathan**, who is a free-lance artist. It depicts Janice's favorite tree, a Norwegian Pine near her home...which she admired regularly in her walks. The scripture was the one she quoted most often in her last days on this earth.

"Hillside with Janice at Night" is the **art piece standing by the pulpit**. It was painted by Nathan for his mother a couple days before she died: "Mother, this is the cradle that I have made for you, filled with the colours of nature that you loved. As you held me, I will hold you...my teacher, my friend."

Words from the Family are given by son, **Marcus**, whose work and interest is moving into domestic and international leadership in both church and society.

Reflection Time recorded music is composed and played by son, **Joel**, who is a musician...teaching, composing, and performing in Saskatoon and beyond.

Support and background work is provided by son, **Jason**, an economist working for the Department of Education in Regina doing computer research.

From her husband's perspective, Janice was gifted by God to be a 'people-person'. She was formed in that direction

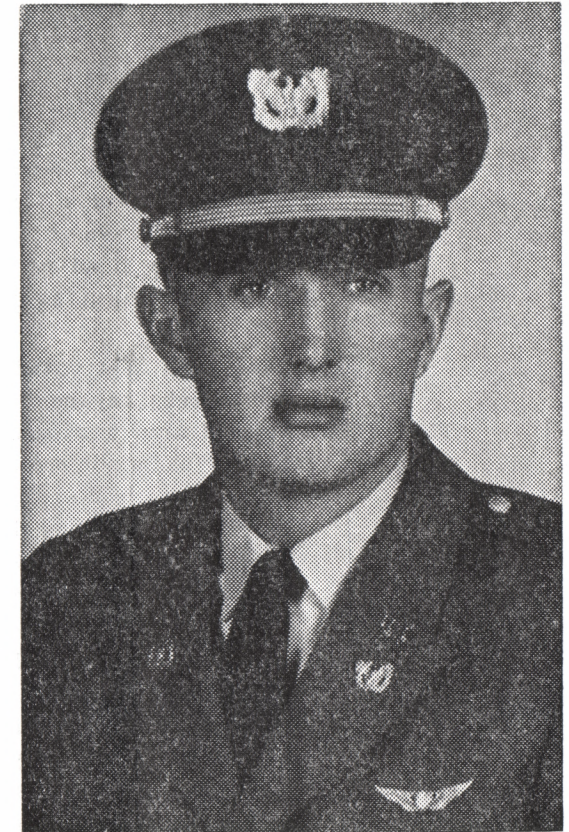

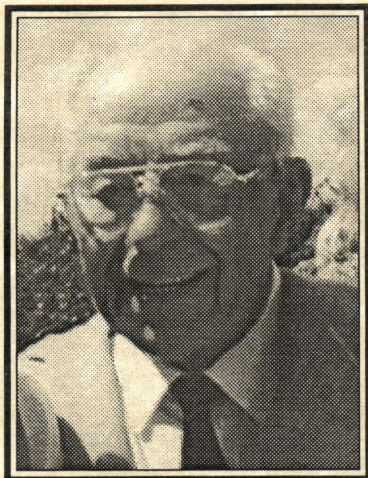
