Eleven o'clock on Sunday, for some people, is when service begins and they expect it to end at twelve or shortly after.

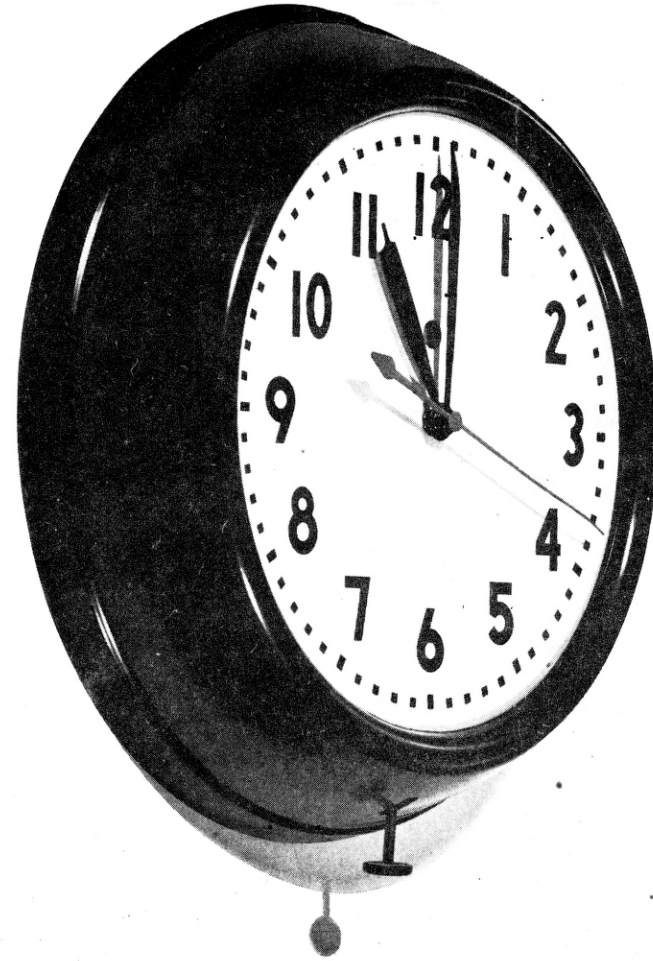
