The last letter I got from Jim he said the weather had been real nice up to that time, I sure hope you have a good winter all through. I hope the boys, have Jimmie & Jones moved yet? I guess they have the place fixed up real nice. And how do Peter & Ed do in all the mud place? The rice house from what I can remember of it. Dont suppose you will see them as often now. Do they still plan to farm the Boy farm? They have sure done well on it so far.

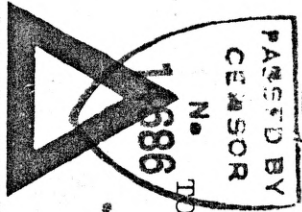
It's hard to keep up with our letter writing
