

# Funeral service for Tamer Jackson

The passing of Tamer Kermet Jackson, 52, occurred in St. Paul's Hospital, Saskatoon on Thursday, May 30, 1963 after a lengthy illness.

Born at Broderick, Sask. on Nov. 10, 1910, as a child he moved with his parents to Kevin, Mont. and then later to Orian, Alta. In 1924 they returned to Sask. and settled in Elbow and Strongfield area.

On June 28, 1958 he was married to Miss Gudrun Tastad and the couple made their home in Elbow.

The late Tamer Jackson was predeceased by his parents and a sister, Mary. He leaves to mourn him his loving wife, Gudrun; five sisters, Mrs. Albert (Francis) Milsten of Elbow, Mrs. Palmer (Alice) Grambo of Domremy, Mrs. Ben (Mavis) Aadland of Strongfield, Mrs. Wesley (Gladys) Welkos of California, Mrs. Edward (Edith) Moulds of Regina; two brothers, Lawrence in Oregon and Sydney in California, and a host of relatives and friends.

Tamer Jackson was a member and deacon of Bethel Lutheran Church at Elbow, an active member with special interest in Bible Camp and Sunday school work. He also took great interest in civic and community affairs.

Funeral services were held at Bethel Lutheran church on Tuesday, June 4 at 1:30 p.m. with Rev. Vernon Roste officiating, assisted by Rev. A. Sandness of

Bisbee, N. Dak. and Rev. R. Olson of Zion Lutheran church, Saskatoon. Mrs. Mel Langager, at the console of the organ, accompanied the congregation in singing two hymns, "In Heaven Above", and "Rock of Ages". Rev. A. Sandness favored with a solo "How Great Thou Art" and a duet was sung by Miss Kathleen Tastad and Rev Sandness, "He Giveth More Grace".

Acting as honorary pallbearers were Norman Ganes, Hal Bjorgan, Carl Vallevand, John Vallevand, Lawrence West and Kaspar Knutson. Active pallbearers were Curly Ganes, Art Vallevand, Gordon Joel, Ed Tastad, Axel Christensen and Tom Brown.

Rev. V. Roste officiated at the memorial service held at Skudenesnes Lutheran church, Loreburn, at 3 p.m. following services at Elbow.

Miss Kathleen Tastad presided at the organ. A greeting was brought by Rev. A. Sandness. Musical renditions consisted of a solo by Rev. Sandness and a duet by Miss Helen Firkingstad and Rev. Sandness.

Rev. R. Olson of Saskatoon gave the message.

Beautiful floral tokens were given at both services as well as many gifts to the memorial fund.

Interment was made in Skudenesnes cemetery. Park Funeral Chapel was in charge of arrangements.
