I, H.O. Nickre and Olaus M. Akre being duly sworn says that he is a citizen of the United States of America; that he knows John Nickre and that he has resided within the territory and jurisdiction of the United States for five years last past, and one year last past within the State of South Dakota; that during that time he has behaved himself as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; that he is not a disbeliever in or opposed to all organized government; that he is not a member of, or affiliated with any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief in or opposition to all organized government; that he does not advocate or teach the duty, necessity or propriety of the unlawful assaulting or killing of any officer or officers, either of specific individuals or of officers generally of the government of the United States or of any other organized government, because of his or their official character and that he has not violated any of the immigration or naturalization laws of the United States.

I, Olaus M. Akre do solemnly swear that I will support the Constitution of the United States of America, and that I do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Power, Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the King of Norway and Sweden whose subject I was. And further, that I never have borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the degrees of Nobility of the Country whereof I have been a subject, and that I have resided within the United States for five years last past, and for one year last past within the State of South Dakota; that I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to all organized government; that I am not a member of or affiliated with any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief in or opposition to all organized government; that I do not advocate or teach the duty, necessity or propriety of the unlawful assaulting or killing of any officer or officers, either of specific individuals or of officers generally of the government of the United States or of any other organized government, because of his or their official character and that I have not violated any of the immigration or naturalization laws of the United States.

BE IT REMEMBERED, That on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four personally appeared before the Honorable J.H. McCoy Presiding Judge of the Circuit Court of Day County, for the Circuit aforesaid, Olaus M. Akre an alien born, above the age of twenty-one years, and applied in open court to be admitted to become a naturalized citizen of the United States of America; pursuant to the several Acts of Congress heretofore passed on that subject. And the said Olaus M. Akre having thereupon produced to the Court record testimony showing that he had heretofore reported himself and filed his declaration of his intention to become a citizen of the United States according to the provisions of said several Acts of Congress, and the Court being satisfied as well from the oath of the said Olaus M. Akre as from the sworn testimony of H.O. Nickre and John Nickre who are known to be citizens of the United States, that the said Olaus M. Akre has resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United States for at least five years last past and at least one year last past within the state of South Dakota, and that during the whole of that time he has behaved himself as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles contained in the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order, well being and happiness of the same; that he is not a disbeliever in or opposed to all organized government; that he is not a member of, or affiliated with any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief in or opposition to all organized government; that he does not advocate or teach the duty, necessity or propriety of the unlawful assaulting or killing of any officer or officers, either of specific individuals or of officers generally of the government of the United States, or of any other organized government, because of his or their official character and that he has not violated any of the immigration or naturalization laws of the United States; which affidavits have been duly made and recorded and are now a part of the record of this naturalization as required by law; and two years, and upwards having elapsed since the said Olaus M. Akre reported himself and filed his declaration of intention as aforesaid.

IT WAS ORDERED, That the said Olaus M. Akre be permitted to take the oath to support the Constitution of the United States, and the usual oath, whereby he renounced all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and more particularly to the King of Norway and Sweden whereof he was heretofore a subject; which said oaths having been administered to the said Olaus M. Akre by the Clerk of said court, and corroborated in all material respects by the sworn testimony of the said H.O. Nickre and John Nickre it is ordered by the Court that the said Olaus M. Akre be admitted to all and singular the rights, privileges and immunities of a naturalized citizen of the United States, and that the same be certified by the Clerk of this Court, under the seal of said Court, which was done accordingly.
