



Skudesnes Lutheran Church 90th Anniversary



On Sunday, July 28, 1996 Skudesnes Lutheran Church, Loreburn, celebrated their 90th anniversary. It was a blessed and joyous occasion. Many members, and former members, friends, and fellow worshippers gathered from near and far with the Skudesnes congregation to glorify God and give Him thanks for His faithfulness and guidance through the past 90 years.

The morning service began with a processional led by Martha Tastad carrying the 90th anniversary banner followed by Pastors S. T. Jacobson and Chris Dean.



The organ and piano prelude "God's Word is Our Great Heritage" was played by Doris Akre and Marilyn Akre. Pastor Chris Dean led the morning worship service and former pastor, Erland Nord read the lessons. Pastor S. T. Jacobson, local pastor, delivered the sermon on the anniversary theme, "God's Word, Our Great Heritage."

Special music was presented by the Jacobson family; Hannah Tastad, daughter of Roger and Laura Tastad; Kathleen McGillvray and Helen Njaa. The opening hymn was "Praise the Lord, the Almighty" and the closing hymn was "Now Thank we all Our God." Other hymns included "Great is Thy Faithfulness" and "God's Word is Our Great Heritage." Pastor Dean closed the morning service with a prayer of thanks and the benediction. Following the morning service the ELW served dinner to approximately 400 guests in the church basement and outdoors in a large tent erected for the day.

Everyone reassembled for the festive afternoon program of music and greetings. Robert Kerney read the scripture taken from Psalm 119. Special music numbers were presented by the Oscar Akre family; a trio by Marilyn Akre, Judy Reed and Gerri Vollmer; the Vollmer family; Allyn and Linda Langager; the Sunday school under the direction of superintendent Judy Brown; and an impromptu choir sang "Beautiful Savior."

Elaine Vollmer introduced all the confirmands from 1906 until the present, acknowledging them by decades. The largest class of 1932 was also recognized, a class of 34 members.

All of the eight children of charter members, Olaus and Lena Akre, were in attendance and were specially recognized. They were Lillian Torgerson, Olga Kerney, Helen Langager, Mildred Joel, Henry Akre, Cecil Akre, Raymond Akre and Oscar Akre.

Written greetings read by Gayleen Vollmer and Glen Vollmer were received from; Bishops Alan Grundahl and Marlin Aadland; Pastors Albert Sandness, Johan Hesje, David Knudson, Gordon Olson and Kenneth Wilsdon; and missionaries Arlin and Ruth Olson. Helen Stamnes, Marlys Gimondo, Arthur Jacobson and Alison Vollmer also sent greetings.

Those present who brought greetings were former pastors, John Lokken and Erland Nord. Pastor Daryl Olson delivered the afternoon message, reiterating his prayer that Skudesnes congregation continue to be a place where God's word goes forth as a light for our lives. A greeting was also brought by Gordon Book of Elbow.




The Sunday school presented a time capsule which they had prepared and filled with various items to be reopened at the church's 100th anniversary.



The mass choir, under the direction of Sharon Wankel, sang the hymn "Blessed Assurance" and "The Hallelujah Chorus" accompanied by Donna Hundeby and Marg Langager.

Pastor Jacobson closed the service with prayer and the benediction. Everyone gathered under the arch of the cemetery where Pastor Jacobson led the children in prayer before they buried the time capsule and covered it with cement, dated 1996.



To commemorate this occasion, the old photograph and scrapbook albums were updated along with a display of pictures and maps. Outside the church the Canadian and Norwegian flags were flying.
