On Sunday, about 375 people attended this historic occasion. The morning service was led by Pastor Lars Knudson, the local pastor, and greetings were read from former pastors, Ostby, Rue and Sandness. One of the sons of the congregation, Dr. S. T. Jacobson, Saskatoon, delivered the sermon on "Wisdom." A brief outline of the 60-year history, in booklet form, was enclosed in the service folder as a momento of the day. To commemorate this occasion also, a photograph and scrapbook album was compiled by Mrs. Glen Vollmer of the early founders and families, early confirmation pictures, and pastors who served the congregation.
