Clara was born in 1882 in Kincardine Twp. and passed away on April 12th, 1963 at North Battleford, Sask. Both Thomas and Clara are buried there. Thomas died in Oct., 1951.

The above information was supplied by Jean (Johnson) Guest in a letter written from Denholm, Sask. on March 6th, 1981.

Thomas Guest was the son of Robert Guest, whose father was Thomas, born in Wexford County, Ireland, in 1784, and Elizabeth Rowe.

Also, according to information received from Mrs. Laurena Guest, of London, Ontario, Thomas Guest and Mary McRoberts were the parents of Ann Guest, of Kinloss Twp., Bruce County, Ont., who married Thomas Foster Collins (F3H) of Kincardine Township on May 12, 1862. The witness of that wedding was John W. Collins, of Huron Twp.

According to information given to me by Laurena Storey, which was written by Mr. Musgrove, of Picton, Ont., Thomas Guest who was born in 1784, died in 1842 and was buried in the grounds of the old church of Kilcormack in the Parish of Kilrush. Thomas had four sons: John, Matthew, Robert and William. Robert Guest married Elizabeth Rowe in Jan., 1861. They were the parents of Thomas Guest who married Clara Colwell.

Mrs. Storey has not established a definite connection between Ann Guest, who married Thomas Foster Collins, and Thomas Guest who married Clara Colwell.

#### THE "WILL" of SAM COLWELL

Probated February Seventh, 1882 Date of Death: April 17, 1865

The Administration of the "Will" was granted to Samuel Colwell and Thomas Stewart, both of the Township of Kincardine in the County of Bruce. "Will" made April 15, 1865.

- 1. My Lot #1, Concession H of Durham Road in the Tp. of Kinloss to be sold to pay any or all debts of my Estate.
- 2. I "Will" and "Bequeath" to my son <u>Tom Colwell</u> Lot #50 Tp.

  Kincardine or as much of it as remains undisposed at the time of my death with provision that within one year after my death he shall pay to my daughter Emily Colwell one hundred dollars and within two years after he shall pay her another one hundred dollars.
- 3. I "Will" and "Bequeath" to my son George Colwell my Lot #70 in the First Conc. North of "D" road in Kincardine Tp.
- 4. Also I "Will" and "Bequeath" to my beloved wife Elizabeth
  Colwell the balance of my Estate after debts are paid. She
  shall use the house rent if or until she re-marries. If
  she does re-marry the property must go to my sons Thomas and
  George.

Another sister of Eliza Stewart, Sarah, married Hiram Griffith: Hiram and Sarah were the parents of Henry(Harry)-F3E5-Collins who married Sarah Ann Griffith. Harry Collins and Sarah Ann Griffith were the parents of Wilbert, Hamlin, Harold, Hiram and Nelson Collins, and of daughters, Mrs. Chambers Helm, Mrs. Harold McIntosh, Mrs. Chambers McKinnon and Mrs. Robert Johnston.

kachel(Stewart) Hunter was the mother of Leslie, Midford, Robert and Stewart Hunter and of Myrtle and Pearl.

Myrtle Hunter married Moy Stringer, a nephew of Bishop Isaac

#### THE COLWELL, COLLINS, McCOSH, HUSTON CONNECTIONS

## ( Records obtained from Annie McCosh) \*

According to the Huron County Records, John Colwell who was born in Ireland in 1799, died in Goderich, Ont. in 1879 and was buried in a Goderich cemetery as John Coldwell. The story goes that John married Mary Anne Browning, who, when a child, hob-nobbed with Queen Victoria.

John and Mary Anne Colwell raised a large family, many of their offspring marrying connections of the COLLINS Family: Their son Francis Colwell married Jane Collins, seventh child of Henry-F2- and Mary(Summers) Collins.

The twelfth child of John Colwell and Mary Anne Browning was George who became the grand father of Mrs. Donald McCosh, Jean (Colwell) Trowse, Florence (Colwell) Pollard, and Ada (Colwell) Farrell who taught in S.S. #13 school on the Fifth Line of Kincardine Twp. Florence Pollard is the daughter of George and Myrtle(Stanley) Colwell, Myrtle being the daughter of Emiline (Collins) Stanley and the grand-daughter of Francis Collins-F3E-who lived on the Fifth Line. wm. Francis Colwell, brother of George Colwell and Ada Farrell married Irene Huston who was related to Rebecca (Collins) Huston who is a second cousin of Reta, Mervyn, and Bill Collins who now farms in Huron Twp.: Irene(Huston) Colwell is the mother of Jean(Colwell)
Trowse who married Orville Trowse, a cousin of the writer, and also closely related to the Gawleys.

Although the above discussion may seem irelevant to most of the relatives who never lived in BRUCE\_County, I have included it here to impress on you with the ramifications of the Relationships of our Families that settled in the BRUCE County(Kincardine and Huron Twps Jalmost 130 years ago. When driving around the concession roads with my brother Bill, who could tell me where relatives had lived and are now living, I thought to myself, this surely is the area where originated the phrase, I AM MY OWN GRANDPA"

THE FRANCIS COLWELL (1834) - JANE COLLINS (1834) FAMILY
- with Family Connections -

(by Mervyn Avery Collins) -1979-

Jane Collins was a sister of Francis  $\underline{K}$ .Collins\* and a daughter of Henry  $\underline{K}$ . Collins and Mary Summers. Francis Colwell was the son of John Colwell.

It is most fitting that in this year 1980, the Bruce County Historical Society should commemorate one of the earliest pioneer families that left Bruce County just one century ago, namely, Francis and Jane Colwell (F3F).

In the spring of 1880, Frank Colwell and his wife, Jane (Collins) Colwell (F3F) with several of their thirteen children, left Bruce County to find a new home in the mid-west. This information is verified in a "Family Record" written by Olive R. McLaughlin, now deceased, who was a granddaughter of Frank and Jane. Quotation: "Francis Colwell ran away from home when his father re-married after his mother's death. He went to Indiana in 1847 and worked in a lumber camp. He returned to Canada and married Jane Collins in 1854. They lived at Bervie near Kincardine, Ontario, where seventeen children were born; triplets and a twin son died there. In the spring of 1880, they crossed Lake Superior to Duluth in a Lake steamer, bringing their cow and two horses. The cow's legs and the horses were hurt in a railroad accident on the way from Duluth to Moorhead which was a small town in a new farming community in Minnesota. Fargo was a tiny village across the Ref River in North Dakota. Will McDonald who was married to their daughter Amanda had previously gone to North Dakota Territory and staked a claim and built a house. This house is still standing on the farm owned by Edison Colwell near Gardner, North Dakota." Referring to the marriage of Frank and Jane in 1854, Olive McLaughlin did not mention where the wedding took place. However, the \*I have put a  $\underline{K}$  after Francis Collins to indicate that he settled in Kincardine Township and to differentiate him from his uncle Francis who settled in Huron Township. The father of Francis K. was Henry, identified in this article as Henry  $\underline{K}$ . His first cousins who settled in Huron Township I have identified as Thomas H., Francis  $\underline{H}$ , and Richard H.

writer has found in the Ontario Archives that Francis Colwell was enumerated in the 1851 census for Lanark County. This indicates that Jane and Francis were married in Lanark or Carleton since Jane was born . at Perth, Ontario in 1834. Also, I question if the family of Jane was in Kincardine Township as early as June, 1854. The Bruce County Atlas of 1881 states that Edward Collins, who was the older brother of Jane Collins, first settled in Kincardine Township in 1855. It is significant, however, that the first daughter of Francis and Jane was born in April, 1855, and the Colwell cousins in North Dakota have told me that all the Children of Francis and Jane were born in Kincardine Township. They have said also that the farm of their grandfather Francis was between Bervie and Ripley and that Ripley was considered their business and social centre. This theory is supported by the Bruce County Directory of 1867 which gives the location of Francis Colwell as 2d, S.D.R., lots 56 and 57. The Kincardine Township "Census Return" of 1881 did not record the family of Francis and Jane Collins. By that time they had moved to North Dakota.

The writer's contact with the Colwell family in North Dakota was initiated through conversations with Lauretta (Collins) Mills and Emily (Collins) Bushell, sisters, and daughters of Mrs. Wellington Guest Collins who lives in Kincardine. It happened that about 1975 there was a Colwell Family Reunion at Ripley which was attended by Frank and Fay Colwell, of Gardner, North Dakota. Frank and Fay live in the house which was built by their grandfather Francis Colwell. They are the sons of David Henry Colwell who was the eldest son of Francis and Jane. David Henry married Marguerite Cuyler who was born at Ripley, the daughter of Alonzo and Louise (Richards) Cuyler. To proceed with the story, Lauretta Mills met the Colwell brothers at the Ripley reunion through their cousin Annie McCosh. This new acquaintanceship resulted in a visit by Morley and Lauretta Mills to Gardner, North Dakota, in 1976, where and when they obtained a considerable amount of information about their relations from the Colwell Family Bible.

Further news of the Francis Colwell family in North Dakota was contained in a letter which Jane had written to her brother Thomas


Foster Collins in 1887, in which she had spoken of their reasonable prosperity and contentment in their new home. This letter had been preserved by Belle Collins, daughter-in-law of Thomas Foster Collins.

As a result of the information available, the writer communicated with different members of the Colwell family in North Dakota and arranged that my wife Ruth and I should visit them in the summer of 1979. The Reunion was held at the summer cottage of Mrs. Iva M. Fillebrown and her brothers Wendell and Harold McCracken at Pelican Lake, Minnesota. There, we met many descendants of Francis and Jane Colwell, who are now scattered across the United States of America.

Because of the deep roots which the Francis Colwell-Jane Collins family had in Bruce County, Ontario, I will record here the names of several of the Colwell children with their spouses who, in several instances, were born there. The names appear in order of their ages.

- 1- Mary Ann, born in 1855, married John Burley in 1873.
- 2- Elizabeth, born in 1856, married John Glass in 1873.
- 3- Maria, born in 1859, married Robert Glass. The Glasses were related to Jim Glass, the father of Howard Glass in Kincardine.
- 4- Deborah Amanda, born in 1861, married William McDonald, of Ripley in 1879.
- 5- Sarah Jane, born 1863, married James Stirling in 1882.
- David Henry, born in 1866, married Marguerite Cuyler in 1891.

  A grandson of David Henry, Cuyler Colwell, now operates the farm where his grandfather lived.



Frank Colwell-F3F7C- the third child of David Henry Colwell and Marguerite Ann Cuyler, and grand -son of Jane Collins-F3F- and Francis Colwell. Also a cousin of many residents of Huron and Kincardine Townships.

The last child born to Francis and Jane Colwell at Bervie was a twin who was named Samuel Preston Colwell. The name suggests that he was related to some of the Samuel Colwells that lived in Bruce County since it was first settled.

Jane (Collins) Colwell was related to many of the Collins'in Bruce County but especially to those in Kincardine and Huron Townships. Jane's sisters were:

- 1- Deborah, born in 1822, Tipperary County, Ireland, who married Patrick Whalen. One of their daughters, Matilda, married Jefferson Cuyler, while one of their sons, Thomas F., married Hanna Maria Stringer.
- 2- Eliza, born in 1828 at Modreeny, Tipperary County, Ireland, married Richard Dagg.
- 3- Anna Maria, born in Ramsay Township, Lanark County, Ontario, in 1836, married Thomas Stewart.

Jane's brothers, who have been mentioned before in this article, were;

Edward, born in Tipperary in 1825, who married Jane Blackwell. Francis K., born in Ramsay Township, Lanark County, in 1832, married Sarah Keough.

Thomas Foster, born in Ramsay Township in 1838, married Ann Guest.

Henry (K) Collins and all his children, including Jane Colwell,
settled in Kincardine Township no later than 1855. His first cousins, Thomas

(H), Richard (H) and Francis (H) settled in Huron Township.

Several genealogists have mentioned the origin of the Collins, Logan Hodgins, Needham, Stanley, Blackwell and other families that emigrated from Tipperary County, Ireland, to Canada West - Lanark and Carleton Counties - from 1829 to 1835. It is understood that they were descendants of \*Protestant soldiers who were taken from England to Ireland during the Conquest of much of Southern Ireland by Cromwell, in the seventeenth century.

Francis Colwell, as mentioned earlier, was born in Nova Scotia, but
his father, John, emigrated to Canada from Tyrone in Northern Ireland.

was a staunch Orangeman and would pace the floor in great fury when they were in trouble and he could do nothing to help their cause. Olive also said about her grandma Jane: "Grandma was a 'ball of fire' - such a worker: she kept the house going, entertained all the children and grandchildren and had a garden and chickens." Janes's grandson, Wendell McCracken of California, told me last summer that his grandmother was a remarkably robust and tough woman who could handle any emergency and take everything in her stride. It has been recorded by Iva McCracken Fillebrown, granddaughter of Jane, that Aunt Jane used to say, "I'm just plain Jane with big feet.", and that also Jane was a mid-wife.

All that I have said or quoted about Francis and Jane Colwell can be clearly substantiated today by the success of their descendants, scattered widely over the United States and some in Western Canada, and by their successful farming operations in the Red River Valley. of Manitoba @ N.D.

I am sure that I speak for the hundreds of distant relatives of Francis and Jane (Collins). Colwell who live in Ontario still when I cordially invite them to "Come back home; you are always welcome."

I wish to express my gratitude to Lauretta (Collins) Mills and her sister Emily (Collins) Bushel, daughters of Mrs. Guest (Belle) Collins, for the information which they gave me to enable me to arrange the first trip to Fargo, N. D. to visit many of our cousins there for the first time.

Rev. Thos. Colwell of Vancouver wrote the following letter to Florence Colwell (Mrs. Cecil Pollard) of Kincardine. She is a daughter of George Golwell and Myrtle Stanley, (see 196. 42) of history granddaughter of George Colwebll and Rebecca Portiss (or Portice) greatgrandfather John Colwell and Mary Ann Browning

\*Your grandfather Colwell grandfather's name was Frank. He had a brother at Kentville, Nova Scotia. Also sisters.

A great- great grandfather Coluell fled to ireland for his conscience sake, and lived and died in Ireland. A big faction of this family is settled near Enniskillen. My father ( John Colwell) knew his father who visited Ontario one time. Edward Colwell near Zion ( north of B ervie ) knew of him.

One sister of my father's grandfather came to Toronto. Her hame was McKnight.

Our grandfather's mother was born in London, England at a place called Rosedale. Her maiden name was Mary Ann Browning and she was supposed to have played with the girl who later became Queen Victoria. This great- grandmother was left an only child. Three others of the family all died of choking - one with a button and the others with cans. This grandmother Colwell's father was wealthy through marriage with a Miss Blackmore

The Colwells and the Brownings were on the same boat coming to this continent. John Colwell and Mary Ann Browning decided to elope. He hid her on the boat under a hogshead (huge barrell). They were married in Nova Scotia. Came to Huron County and lived in the Goderich, Holmesville, Bayfield area.

This grandfather had a brother, Edward, who was drowned at Kincardine.

Mrs. George Stewart of Zion, was of this family. Also Sam who died
at B ervie. Also Sam Eliza Ann. This Ann married an Austin
and moved to near Detroit. There is a son who is a Saptist minister.

My grandfather's name was John. My grandmother Colwell's forother was Sir Roland Blackmore. He was coming in a ship with a coach and six horses to see my father's mother in Nova Scotia but was lost at sea.

My great-grandfather Browning was supposed to have been poisoned by the mother of Sir Charles Hupper.
