

COIT, William L., merchant of Montreal,
died at New London, Ct., 12th ult.; age, 40.

COLBURN, Mrs. Rebecca, who joined the Me-
thodist Church in Ireland c. 1800, died in
Fenbroke, Dec. 3, 1838; age, 57; survived by
her sons. - May 15, 1839, p. 115, 0.

COLCLOUGH, Maria Constantia, eldest daugh-
ter of Maj. Colclough, died at the residence
of Capt. Ussher, Cobourg; age, [4]9. - Feb. 5,
1840, p. 59, D.N.

COLDWELL, Mrs. Elizabeth, nee Brander,
was born in Woolwich, England, June 6, 1782, and
moved with her parents, in her youth, to
Grenada, W.I., where she married John Coldwell,
July 10, 1798. They returned to Ireland, his
birthplace, in 1803, lived briefly in various
places on the continent since he was in the
British Artillery, and came back to Ireland in
1813. Mrs. Coldwell lost 6 children, and then
her husband in 1829. In 1832, she came to
Canada with her 4 surviving children, and
settled in the Home District. She died in
Chinguacousy twp., Jan. 26, 1849, 2 weeks after
the death of her son, Matthew; survived by 3
children. - May 30, 1849, p. 131, 0.

COLDWELL, Matthew, son of John and Eliza-
beth Coldwell, was born in Woolwich, England,
Nov. 13, 1808, and moved with his parents to
Ireland, his father's native land when he was
5. When he was in his 21st year, his father
died. In 1832, he came to Canada with his
father, 2 brothers and a sister (6 other bro-
thers and sisters having died), and settled
in Chinguacousy twp. In Jan., 1840, he married
Mary Ann Shields. He died in Chinguacousy twp.,
Nov. 14, 1849; survived by his mother, wife,
and 5 children. - May 30, 1849, p. 131, 0.

COLE, Daniel, a native of Long Island, N.Y.,
and the oldest settler in Adolphustown, died
at Adolphustown, Aug. 5, 1836; age, 105 y.,
1 m., 12 d.; survived by 8 children, 75 grand-
children, 172 great grandchildren, and 13
great-great grandchildren. - Sept. 21, 1836,
p. 11, D.N.
