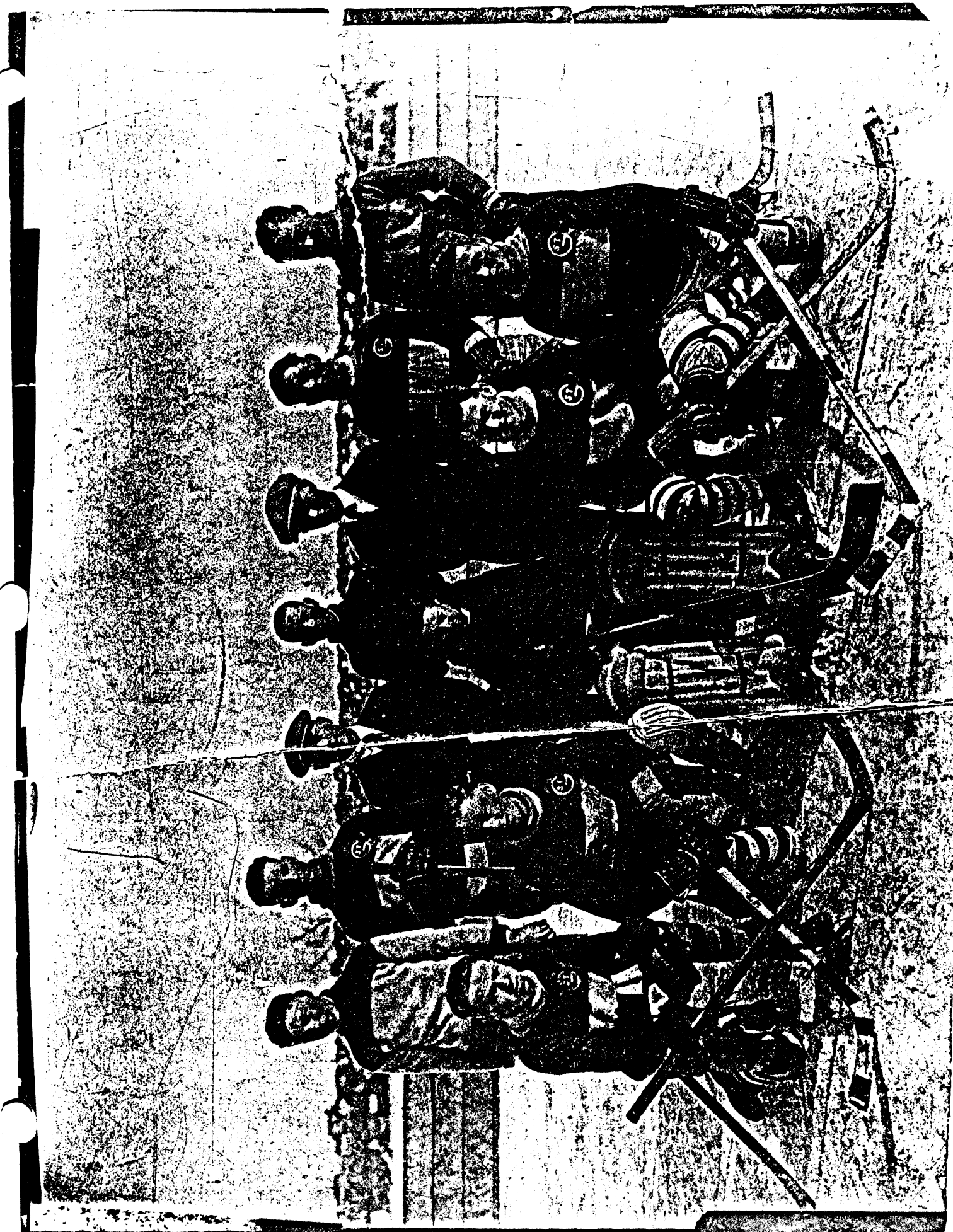

SENIOR BASEBALL LEAGUE AVERAGES COMPILED TO DATE

Undoubtedly the most startling change in the City League averages since they were last published is the giant strides made by Sutherland in the club batting order, they now being in second place, only six points behind the Liberals, while they have also improved in club fielding and now tie the Catholic club in the cellar position. With the great improvement the club's figures show in batting it is not surprising that it should be two Sutherland men who head the individual batting order, Struthers being top with the fine percentage of .600, and Campbell W. being equal second with .500, while Potter has been hitting at a .384 clip and Campbell at .371. Then Haskell, Brower, McGinnis and McOrmond are all over the .300.

There is little change in the general standing either in batting or fielding

it being chiefly the newcomers to the league who have been doing the big things.

MacMILLANS DEFEATED VARSITY AND TORIES TRIMMED THE BANKERS

Not a single penalty was handed out in the first game of last night's double header between the Varsity and MacMillans and this fact, together with the leniency that the referee, Dr. Des Rosiers, showed on off-sides tended towards a very fast game, there being very few stoppages. The play was exceedingly keen and although there were a couple of men hurt—Paul and P. Garrison, the former of whom had to leave the ice and did not return—these were apparently accidental and in neither case was a penalty handed out. When Paul left the ice Berry went off to even the teams and for the last quarter of an hour's play we saw six-man hockey, which, if anything, made the play even faster than it was before.

The honors went to MacMillans by four goals to two and this perhaps just about represents the run of the game as the winners showed the better stick handling and combination, though the Varsity boys seemed to have the edge on the score of condition.

NEIL M'KELLAR DIES AT GLENCOE

Ill Short Time, "Grand Old Man" Passes at 86

IN IMPLEMENT BUSINESS

Funeral Services To Be Held This Afternoon

GLENCOE, Nov. 5 — Neil McKellar, Glencoe's "grand old man", for 58 years in the agricultural implement business here and in many parts of Canada, died yesterday at his home after a brief illness. He was in his 87th year.

Much of his more than a half a century in the implement business he was connected with the Massey-Harris Company. Following 14 years' service in Glencoe he was four years at Ottawa, nine years in Guelph, two years in Chatham, nine in Saskatoon and for the past 20 years in his home town here.

Mr. McKellar was born in Metcalfe Township near Kilmartin, of Scottish parentage. He received his education in the old log schoolhouse at Walkers. From the time he was a small boy he worked on a farm and his interest has since been in farmers and their problems. He started in the implement business in 1882 prior to which he had been at Winnipeg where he was engaged taking freight to Battleford by Red River boat.

Despite his age and an accident three years ago, he was retained as salesman by his company; with the aid of an assistant carrying on his business to the present. He was widely read and conversant with affairs of his time but never entered politics or municipal life.

Surviving are his wife, formerly Miss Helen Munro; one son, Malcolm, in Saskatoon, and a son-in-law, Dawson McPherson, manager of Massey-Harris in Winnipeg.

The funeral service will be held at his residence, on Monday, at 2 p.m., conducted by Rev. Fred Douglas, of Glencoe Presbyterian Church, assisted by Rev. Dr. Angus A. Graham, of London, a lifetime friend. Interment will be in Kilmartin Cemetery.

McKELLAR — The death of Malcolm Ross McKellar age 91 years of the Veterans Home, Saskatoon occurred at his residence on November 4, 1984. The Funeral Service will be held on Tuesday, November 6th at 10:30 a.m. from the Chapel of Saskatoon Funeral Home conducted by Rev. Ed Loucks. Surviving are: two daughters, Audrey (Mrs. Clayton Fuller) of Saskatoon and Florence (Mrs. Norman Quick) of Lethbridge; four grandchildren, Carol (Mrs. Garth Tastad) and Cam Fuller of Saskatoon, Brian Quick and his wife, Ilse of Lethbridge and Bruce Quick of Vancouver; four great-grandchildren, Kristen, Karen, Kirk and Sarah. He was predeceased by his wife, Verna in 1980, by a brother, Duncan and a sister, Florence. Mr. McKellar was born on July 5th, 1893 in Glencoe, Ontario and came west to Saskatoon in 1912. He served with the 13th Battalion, Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders. He went overseas in 1915 and in 1917 was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant. During the war he was wounded three times. Mr. McKellar returned to Saskatoon and was married to Mary Verna Colwell on June 1, 1921. He was a member of the Institute of Accredited Accountants and the International Society of Computer Accountants. He retired in 1965. In his early years he was interested in all sports. He played junior hockey with the Toronto Canoe Club during the 1911-1912 season and senior hockey with the R.J. McMillan team in Saskatoon during the 1913-1914 season.
