It was February 18, 1919, that a few Lutheran people of Scandinavian descent gathered to form a congregation, naming it Trinity Lutheran Church. The congregation counted 19 charter members.

The first meeting place — built a year later — was a chapel at the northeast corner of Eastlake and 11th Street, where the building still stands as a private dwelling.

About 10 years later, the name of the congregation was changed to Zion Lutheran Church. In 1947 it relocated to Fourth Avenue and 19th Street at the foot of the Broadway Bridge. Finally, in 1964, a third building was erected beside the previous one and this is the present sanctuary. The congregation now numbers about 1200 people.

Zion may be unique as the church that moved from Nutana into the downtown area. It has been suggested the "foot of the Broadway Bridge" location was chosen to help maintain the link between the two communities.

Over its first 60 years, it was a one-pastor church but by 1978 its program for all ages required the services of two pastors and a youth worker.

Zion Lutheran Church has always been considered a leading congregation of the Lutheran Church across Canada, and retains its vigor as one of a dozen Lutheran congregations now in the city.

A neighbourhood parish had never been a consideration for Zion. It has always drawn its membership from every corner of the city. Downtown is a prime location because the number of apartments and condominiums means a great number of people living downtown.
