# Willdon School Reunion

July 14-15, 1959 were the days for the Willdon School Reunion. The morning of the 14th saw the trees surrounding school yard all cut and freshly mowed. The original flag pole pulled and erected in its place, proudly making the Canadian flag. It made it even more attractive and inviting. A sign was at the base of it with "Willdon School Reunion No. 100" in bold letters. There by its side stood an old school desk, with many of the pupils' initials carved in it. It made a lovely setting for the trailers and motor homes that started to arrive in the forenoon. However, because of heavy showers plans were changed. Cars in the cars and trucks made it possible to spread the word that we were moving to the Strongfield hall for the pot luck supper. A registration area was soon set up where we received our name tags, address buttons and packets with the program and the school history booklet. An added attraction to this table was a miniature Willdon school made by Johnnie Johnson, which contained pictures of the furnishings.

A hot pot luck supper started at 5:30 with many former students and their families. After the table was cleared we made up our minds to bring our children to the children's picnic. A table was set up for the children's picnic.

A luncheon was made during the evening, much visiting and reminiscing was done before we gathered for an old-fashioned sing song. We enjoyed good background music with piano, banjo and two guitars as well as the speakers. I seemed no one was in a hurry to leave, but before we did there was more coffee. We had to break away so as to be able to be back again before seven o'clock to prepare the pancake and sausage breakfast. Then there was just time to clear away and get ready for our eleven o'clock worship service. Aksel Christensen was Master of

Ceremonies throughout the day. We were fortunate to have several ministers with us, and we are proud to say they were former pupils of Willdon. Rev. Oliver Vestre had scripture reading and prayer following the opening hymn, there were several musical numbers, then Rev. Don McPherson presented a

most interesting sermon, linking our school days with our spiritual life. Maynard Olson had prayer, the service closed with "Blest Be The Tie That Binds".

A delicious banquet was served, during this hour a few presentations were made. Helen Stammae and LeRoy Olson had made and donated cups with Willdon inscriptions. These were given to five people, first Cecily Martin, whose father the school was named after, then Alma "Thorvald" Christensen, who was the oldest pupil present, the youngest pupil when the school closed, Wanda "Ferkingsstad" McMurchy, the one that came the farthest, Oliver Vestre, then Evelyn "Tastad" Hundebj, who had been a pupil there, taught there, her children went there, and the land on which the school stood belonged to her.

At four o'clock many visitors came to hear the program that had been arranged. It opened with a sing song, there were songs solo, duets, quartets, a Barber Shop group and instrumental numbers, as well as a number of a skit which caused a lot of laughter and applause. Following greetings from former teachers and pupils. We closed with the singing of "God is With Us". We hope to have another reunion in the future at the former Willdon School grounds.
