Dear Mr Tastad

I have now completed about half of the research you requested and thought you would like to have a copy of the results. I have numbered the pages of the report so that if you have any questions you can just refer to that page by number.

Beginning with the Fullers.

I did not find George b1781 in the 1851 census. He was not in Middlesex County in that census. The 1851 census Warwick twp is missing. I might find him in land records. I found him living with son George in 1861. I assume he is buried in Warwick. I assume that the George, aged 29 in 1861, who lived with George b 1781, and George b 1821, was the son of your William. It would appear that the family moved from Ireland to Quebec where they stayed a while, and then moved on to Ontario.

I found Duncan McKeller in the 1851 census Metcalf but not in 1861.

Re the Colwells.

I found John b 1799 in the 1861 census Goderich twp. (The 1851 for Goderich is missing). I believe the marriage I found was his. I believe Jane's age of 36 in 1861 is probably wrong by about \$0\$ years since in 1871 she is 67. I have included all the Colwells I found in Kincardine. There seems to have been a mix-up with your Samuel. In 1861 he is listed as James but in 1871 he becomes Samuel. There is another Samuel in 1861 - perhaps he was James. Also your James/Samuel claims to have been born in Ontario in 1861 census and in Nova Scotia in 1871 census. I believe the family came from Ireland and settled in Nova Scotia for some years then moved to Ontario c1837 (son John claims to have been born in Ontario).

I also include some marriages I found which appear to have been children of John Sr.

I will continue with the census then I could go on with land records, wills (if any), obits, if you have exact death dates. If you have any comments or directions please let me know.

I did not find Capt Duncan McLean in Southwold twp and I could not locate a Stoney Island.
